

BookQuest is an independent reading program for all students in grades 1 – 8. The purpose of this program is to encourage our youth to read quality books as they build a habit of reading throughout the year.

- 1. Students select books from a designated list.
 - a. The books on the list are carefully selected by teachers based on the quality of the writing/illustration, message, and story interest. These books are considered classics or emerging classics.
 - b. Each grade level has a list of 20 books. Older grades have combined lists.
 - c. As the BookQuest program progresses in the coming years, additional book titles may be added by the school at the start of a new school year.
- 2. All students will be expected to read 1 book from the list each quarter (minimum expectation). Since there are four quarters in a school year, the minimum expectation is to read four books from the list in one school year. Report cards will contain an area where a teacher can communicate to parents whether the minimum expectation for each quarter is met. Since this program is "outside" the regular curriculum, it does not receive a grade on a report card.
- 3. Students are free to choose a book that interests them from the list. If a classroom copy is unavailable, they are encouraged to find a copy on their own from any library.
- 4. Students will demonstrate their understanding of the book by completing a simple form illustrating their knowledge and feedback on the book. Parents will sign the form acknowledging the student has read the book. This isn't designed to be a comprehensive quiz, rather, it is meant to provide some accountability that they have read the book. The form is attached at the end of this document.
- 5. To incentivize student reading beyond the minimum expectations, there will be levels of recognition based on how many books a student reads. Students can progress through the ranks as they read more books. The librarians will manage a bulletin board that will publicly display student reading progression.

- 6. At the end of the year, book gift certificates will be awarded to those who have accomplished the following:
 - a. reached the King or Queen level or beyond.
 - b. highest reader (based on progression levels) in each of the following grade level brackets: 1^{st} 2^{nd} , 3^{rd} 5^{th} , 6^{th} 8^{th}
- 7. All students will return to floor level at the start of each school year.
