I want to warmly welcome everyone back to a new school year. The fresh energy of June has given way to August which is a little more tired and worn. It is that time of year when we put our school clothes back on, pack our bags, and get back to learning. It's a good thing to have the building fill up with life once again.

There will be quite a few changes this coming school year. Some of these changes arrived by strategic planning, others arrived by responding to situations outside our control. time with family and friends. I am looking forward to getting back into the classroom and getting to know the students and families of Adams better. Please stop by and say "hi" if you are in the building!



Enrollment for the 2022/23 school year was completed on schedule with 271 students from 116 families. We have one family less than last year, but the same number of students. Over the years we have



# Just a few reminders!

School starts Tuesday, September 8 at 8:30 A.M and ends at 3:10 p. Buses leave at 3:15p. Kindergarten will have half days that first week of school.

- School Entry: Just a reminder that during the school day, all school doors will be locked. All visitors can enter the building through Door A.
- If a student stays home because of an illness or any other reason, the <u>office</u> must be informed
   prior to 9 AM by a phone call or parent signed note. Otherwise, they will be issued an unexcused tardy.
- The **office** must be notified of planned appointments/absences during the school day. The office in turn will notify the teacher and the bus driver of these planned absences.
- **Tardy:** Please be reminded that any student who arrives to school after the 2<sup>nd</sup> bell has run (8:35a) will be issued a tardy. If the tardy is due to a legitimate reason, the parents must notify school that morning and it will be considered an **excused tardy**; otherwise, they will be given an **unexcused tardy**. Students cannot excuse themselves.
- If a student must leave during school hours, the student needs to obtain a "check-out slip" from the teacher. This slip must be given to the office before leaving school. The student will remain in the office area until parents arrive. If the student returns the same day, he must stop at the office to get a "check-in slip." The student will not be allowed back into the classroom without this slip.

### Thank you!

Below are the requirements and recommendations from the Kent County Health Department regarding COVID:

#### 1. Student/Staff with COVID:

"Isolation at home is <u>required</u> per Public Health Code. Isolation is 10 days, with a minimum of 5 days at home. If the positive person has stayed home for at least 5 days, is overall feeling better, has been fever-free without the use of fever-reducing meds for 24 hours, AND is able to correctly and consistently wear a mask, then they can return to work or the classroom while masked for days 6-10. If they do not meet ALL of the criteria listed, then they need to stay home for 10 days."

### 2. Student/Staff who are household contacts of person with COVID:

"Quarantine at home is <u>recommended</u>, regardless of vaccination, for personal/household contacts that are unable to mask around others. This does include exposure in childcare settings for those under the age of 2. They would be recommended to stay at home for 10 days, as well as monitor for symptoms for those 10 days and test 3-7 days after their last exposure. If they are being continually exposed to a positive person in the household, their 10 days would begin once the positive household member is out of isolation."

"For exposure in schools or childcare (over the age of 2): they can continue attending, but it is recommended that they mask for 10 days after their exposure and monitor for symptoms. It is also recommended that they test if symptoms develop."

### To simplify:

- 1. **Isolation** of individuals with COVID is a REQUIREMENT.
- 2. Quarantine of individuals who have household contacts with COVID is a RECOMMENDATION.
