Christian Schools for End Times

"And when the thousand years are expired, Satan shall be loosed out of his prison, and shall go out to deceive the nations which are in the four quarters of the earth, Gog and Magog, to gather them together to battle: the number of whom is as the sand of the sea. And they went up on the breadth of the earth, and compassed the camp of the saints about..." Rev. 20:7-9

The Kingdom of Man is assembling itself. It may not appear like it at first glance. It may look like the world is ready to burst apart. The world is in turmoil. Yet, behind the physical curtain, there is a spiritual reality. And the spiritual reality is that the world is gathering.

The Kingdom of Man, while it may not be homogenous on the outside, is unified in its purpose. Its purpose has never wavered from the beginning. It was the purpose of the Tower, the structure that once lined the Babel skyline. The tower that declared "*let us make us a name*" (Gen. 11:4). A tower that declares to God "You are nothing. Man is everything!" The world is assembling itself in the great purpose of establishing a kingdom that is finally and forever free of the "oppression" of God's authority.

The unrest we see in the world around us are the pains that accompany the birth of a new great social order the ends of which "can be attained only by the forcible overthrow of all existing social conditions" (The Communist Manifesto, K. Marx). The riots in the streets, the spread of protesting and marches, the flaming fires of impaired race relations, these are not signs of future chaos and regression, but are the announcement that a new societal order is being born.

There is one social condition which is a final hurdle for man's kingdom. It really isn't a social condition, but it can manifest itself as one. It is an orientation of heart and mind that acknowledges God's Word is authoritative. It is the planting of a flag on the mountain of God's Holy Word. It becomes a social condition when homes, schools, businesses, and governments acknowledge God as the supreme authority. And God's authority is the misery of Man's Kingdom. This has always been the tangible dividing point between God's Kingdom and man's kingdom. The final hurdle.

This is the dividing point I've experienced in my education at university. A Christian doesn't see wickedness in human philosophy by observing ugliness in it. A Christian won't be tipped off to the vain imaginations of man if that Christian is looking for irrationality. The philosophies that are building the Kingdom of Man are intriguing. They are outwardly beautiful. They are orderly. They are personally

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empowering. They are new and exciting. God created man to be a rational creature. That rationality didn't fall away when Adam sinned. Neither is it disappearing as centuries go by. The Kingdom of Man is being built on logically sound thought.

But they are building it on godless thought. They build their philosophies with material reality only. The thing that stands in the way is the *authority* of God's Word. This is the dividing point. They will build and build their arguments and construct their theories, but they will do so in a world that doesn't look past the material.

The Kingdom of Man cannot rule if God's Word is authoritative. It cannot be sovereign if God is sovereign. So, it must kill God's authority. It will be quite comfortable allowing God to exist.

So, while the world gathers, the saints of Christ camp. Revelations 20 declares God's people will be a "*camp of saints*." Camping is quite different from gathering and assembling. Camping is a state of togetherness. The world is going out and collecting. The saints are together. Not necessarily a physical togetherness, but a spiritual one.

But this camp also means "encampment." It is an encampment of soldiers. An army that stands ready with the one weapon the Kingdom of Man despises the most, God's Word. And this army of saints wields it, not because this Word is linguistically convincing to the enemy, but because it is authoritative. It is the power of the Holy King.

So, what does this mean for a Christian school? A Christian school can have the kindest teachers. It can claim to be free from gross immoralities in the classrooms and hallways. It can create the most wonderful, family-like atmosphere. But this is meaningless if that school, supported by the parents, does not educate and rear the children with the belief and practice that God's Word is authority. Our children need to know and understand that in all areas of their life – in family, in art, in music, in recreation, in education, in church, in politics, in labor, in all of life - God's Word is authoritative. This will manifest itself in the camping of the saints. Allegiance to a King so much greater than the kings of men will unify the saints and bring out the togetherness from which the Kingdom of Man circles around.

By God's grace and providence, may we labor this year in educating our children in the light of God's Word. We can equip our children by teaching them and by being an example to them that the holy scriptures live loudly in our lives and His Word is authority. Let's encourage ourselves in II Timothy 3:13, 14: "But evil men and seducers shall wax worse and worse, deceiving, and being deceived. But continue thou in the things which thou hast learned and hast been assured of... the holy scriptures, which are able to make thee wise unto salvation through faith which is in Christ Jesus."

Last year the finance article I wrote for the August Announcer started with these words "A new school year always brings new challenges. This upcoming school year is certainly no exception. Challenges for our school and challenges for the families of our school." This year is no different. A new fiscal year has begun at Adams Christian School. This means a new school year. Also, a new budget year. Also, new school board members. Also, new teachers. Also, new students. And a myriad of other "new things" that I cannot even think of or predict. Many things have changed over the last year. All in God's perfect plan. But....many which we would not have chosen. Many, awful. And many which have affected and will affect this good Christian school.

The fiscal year is off and running and a new drive and new tuition schedule are in effect. We are thankful for the donations that have arrived for the drive thus far. A drive is impossible to predict, and the timing of when the drive donations arrive is not consistent from year to year. As of the writing of this article, ACS has received around \$100,000 of the \$345,000 drive goal. At the same time the prior two years we had received \$166,000 and \$133,000, respectively. I've been asked how I think the drive might look this year, given some turmoil in the donor base. My answer is a clear "I don't know". But I thought I would include an update with the current drive comparisons, and gently encourage everyone to remember the ACS drive in your giving.

A new tuition year has also begun. We remind families that tuition is due on the first of each month. We are thankful that families have made it a priority to pay their tuition on time. Support ACS? Timely tuition sure supports ACS. In my two years on this school board, the list of delinquent tuition has been very light. A few months we had none. NONE!!!! How thankful we are for this. Because each year brings new families and tuition schedules, the year often starts out with a few late payments, as ACH and auto-pay get worked out, and families remember that the new school year has begun. So please remember to make those tuition payments timely.

This upcoming year is certain to bring financial challenges to ACS. Enrollment decline and changes in our donor base is a reality.

Please remember ACS in your prayers. Remember ACS with your financial gifts. Remember the students. Remember the teachers, administrator, and support staff. Remember the school board. Send them a kind word. Support them. Love them. All of this, by the grace of God.
