School Finances - Thank You Moms

he instructions for the October board newsletter for the finance committee indicate we should remind our constituents of the ongoing support drive, timely payment of tuition, and other finance updates. I'll include that here. Our support drive is very important to our school as it provides nearly twenty percent of our annual budget. We are thankful that ACS supporters have faithfully made this drive a reality year after year, even though it is at no small sacrifice to their personal finances. You should be receiving your fall drive mailing in the upcoming days. The support drive goal for 2020-2021 is \$330,000. We have collected around \$163,000 already, leaving about \$167,000 remaining to be collected. We ask that you remember the drive in your prayers and yearend giving. We also remind parents that tuition is due on the first of each month. As in prior years, the year has started off well and tuition is generally arriving on time without issues. For that we thank you all.

Another matter we wanted to touch on is the great thanks we owe to the mothers of our children, for the many ways in which they make school finance possible. While this article doesn't suppose that every home's situation is the same, the reality is that in the vast majority of our homes, the father works at a job outside of the home to earn wages, some of which go to paying the school tuition, while the mother stays and takes care of the home. May we never forget the great sacrifices and tireless labors of the mom in the home, that make the father's daily vocation even possible. We get up in the morning, go to work, work all day, and come home. would be nearly impossible without the million things (maybe an overstatement for emphasis, although maybe not) that mom did at home, that allowed us to be gone all day at work. Up early, getting the kids out of bed. Picking the outfit for them for the day, even though they don't like even one combination mom chooses. Making breakfast, encouraging them on the day ahead, last minute cram for the spelling test, maybe learn a few questions from the catechism book, calming a few nerves, sending them off on the bus, or even driving them to school. I'd be done for the day at that point. Then off to get ready to take another to preschool. Then on to school to help with hot lunch. Keeping our Students Safe Online

inishing the end of last school year with remote learning required students, staff, and parents to work together to finish the year strong. As a Board we are thankful for all who supported this unexpected challenge, and we are also thankful for the technology our school is furnished with that helped facilitate this remote learning. The new school year is now well underway, and we are grateful that the children have been able to return to school for in-person instruction.

In this article, I would like to highlight something that the Technology Committee (and the Board) takes very seriously - keeping our students safe online. We are all well aware of the dangers associated with the Internet. With over 150 Chromebooks along with a number of other devices in use at ACS, it is important that we have an efficient and effective way to oversee this technology. Our school currently uses a program called GoGuardian. This program filters and monitors the Internet activity of the devices at school. Using this program, teachers are able to monitor the screen of every child in their classroom at any given time. The program will also send out a notification if a student tries to access an inappropriate site. We have found that this program works very well for us, and we plan to continue using this for the foreseeable future.

During remote learning this past spring, some families used Chromebooks borrowed from ACS. Some parents may have wondered about whether these borrowed Chromebooks had any Internet protection once they were connected to their home network. We are happy to report that the GoGuardian software retains its functionality, even when the Chromebook is used at home by the student. The same filtering, monitoring, and notification system is in place, even when the Chromebook is used somewhere other than ACS.

Our goal at ACS is to use technology in a responsible, Godglorifying way. Please contact me or any member of the Board if you have questions or concerns regarding the technology in use at ACS. Let all of us heed the words of Paul in I Corinthians 10:31, and apply it to ourselves and our families regarding our use of technology: "...whatsoever ye do, do all to the glory of God".
